

Farmer Ross revamped the Harvest Community Supported Agriculture (CSA) program—which provides locally grown produce to residents— this year by adding an a la carte menu in addition to the monthly subscription. This new option allows residents to purchase the produce they want when they want it. Our residents responded well to this addition and has grown our CSA participation. Farmer Ross includes his own produce as well as produce and other items from other local farmers.

NORTH TEXAS FOOD BANK



The family farming heritage is what inspired Harvest. Our residents enjoy farm-to-table produce, modern country living, community connection, and homegrown friendships. In so many ways, gardening nourishes the soul of our community.

In total, our community has donated more than 241,830 meals to the North Texas Food Bank!

Our theme is living a bountiful life, which also means sharing our bounty with those in need. Since our first residents moved here in 2014, our community has donated more than 241,830 meals to the North Texas Food Bank and its partners. In 2022, Harvest neighbors have donated more than 47,758 meals.

We believe that we are raising up the next generation of philanthropists. Our Teen Council plans events that benefit the North Texas Food Bank. In 2022, they have donated 5,500 meals through their Hoops for Hunger, Summer Peanut Butter Drive, Cornhole Tournament, and the Harvest Turkey Trot.

Because of our community farm and garden plots, we were able to provide more than 2,933 pounds of fresh produce. Our local food bank partner loves receiving fresh produce! It's not something they receive often so they are so appreciative!
